



It is going well for Swedish and Danish life science, but global challenges push for transformation


- A need to adapt to the ever-rising costs of development and increased pricing pressure

STRONGER INNOVATION AND SUPPORT SYSTEM


New strategies and initiatives to strengthen Swedish and Danish life science

- Major investments are being made in the two materials research facilities, MAX IV and European Spallation Source




SWE AND DK IS THE EU INNOVATION LEADERS

RISE IN THE NUMBER OF PATENTS

Sharp rise in the number of applications in Danish pharmaceuticals

The number of **Danish** patent applications in the life sciences to the European Patent Office (EPO) rose 10% last year

Swedish patent applications rose by 4% – most in biotech – but medical technology continues to dominate



THE LIFE SCIENCE INDUSTRY IN MEDICON VALLEY

A stagnation in revenue for big pharma, continued growth for biotech and medtech

Organizational changes, new strategies and new products in the leading pharmaceutical companies Medicon Valley's biotech companies are thriving. Some of the region's biotech companies have entered a strong growth phase

The medtech sector continues to grow on all parameters, turn-over, export and contribution to GDP



RECORD-HIGH LIFE SCIENCE EXPORTS


Life science exports from Denmark and Sweden have hit an all-time high

+7.7%

After a modest increase in 2017, Danish life science export rose by 7.7% to 106 billion DKK in 2018

+10.6%

Swedish life science companies gathered new strength in 2018, increasing life science exports 10.6%



VALUE OF EXPORTS IN LIFE SCIENCE IN MILLIONS

RECORD-HIGH LIFE SCIENCE EXPORTS

Growing Danish and Swedish life science exports in 2018

USA is the largest export market for Danish life science. **Danish** life science exports to the **USA**, **increased in 2018 with 21%** China is the largest export market for Swedish life science. **Swedish** life science exports to China, **increased in 2018 with 21%** Denmark is the fourth largest exporter of life science products per capita, while Sweden is the tenth largest







INCREASING TAX CONTRIBUTIONS IN LIFE SCIENCE

In 2017 the life science industry contributed more in taxes than in the preceding year

The Danish life science sector contributed **19.6** billion DKK in tax revenue in 2017, which is a 20% increase from 2016 In Denmark, revenue from corporation tax has never been higher. In Sweden, contributions from corporation tax on life science companies is at the highest level since 2011

The Swedish life science sector contributed 12.7 billion SEK in tax revenue 2017. This is a 5.2% increase from 2016







RISING EMPLOYMENT IN MEDICON VALLEY


Medicon Valley is home to the largest pool of life science talents in Scandinavia

4 SUGGESTIONS FOR THE FUTURE

Actions to make Medicon Valley stronger for the benefit of both Sweden and Denmark

- Ensure national resources to support cross-border research, establishment of private-public consortiums and collaboration platforms in Medicon Valley
- Ensure a cross-border collaboration for clinical trials in Medicon Valley
- Ensure a single coordinated effort to attract international life science talents, venture capital and investments to the region
- Ensure a well-integrated labor market in Medicon Valley, removal of cross-border barriers for commuters and reduced prices for crossing the Oresund bridge



SUMMARY AND MAIN CONCLUSIONS

Life science is in a transformational phase, but is of growing importance for Sweden and Denmark


New strategies and initiatives strengthen the life science innovation and support system The **growing** Danish and Swedish life science **exports** in 2018 have hit an **all-time high** The tax contribution from employees' income tax and corporation tax increases in both countries
